COUNTY OF VANCE

The Vance County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, December 5, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairman Eddie L. Wright, Commissioners Terry E. Garrison, Deborah F. Brown, Dan Brummitt, Thomas S. Hester, Jr., J. Timothy Pegram, and Gordon Wilder.

Absent: None.

Also present were County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue, Finance Director Steven C. Stanton, County Attorney Jonathan S. Care, and Clerk to the Board Kelly H. Grissom.

Chairman Eddie L. Wright gave the invocation.

The first order of business was the election of Chairman. Before entertaining a motion, Chairman Wright thanked the Board of Commissioners for allowing him to be Chairman this past year and thanked the County Manager and his staff for their help throughout the year.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to appoint Terry E. Garrison as Chairman for the coming year. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Chairman Garrison thanked the Board for this opportunity and thanked Commissioner Wright for his service this past year. Chairman Garrison emphasized his desire to help bring more jobs to Vance County, improve education opportunities, provided continued support to the Sheriff's Department, and complete necessary actions to begin laying pipe for public water. Another goal is to dispose of or facilitate active use of all vacant properties fully owned by the County.

The next order of business was the appointment of Vice-Chairman. Motion was made by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright, seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown, vote unanimous, to appoint Thomas S. Hester, Jr. as Vice-Chairman for the coming year.

Motion was made by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown to appoint Kelly H. Grissom as Clerk to the Board for a one-year term. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder and unanimously approved.

The next order of business was the appointment of County Manager. Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright, vote unanimous, to appoint Jerry L. Ayscue as County Manager for a one-year term.

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., vote unanimous, to appoint Steven C. Stanton as Finance Director for the coming year.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown moved to appoint Jonathan S. Care as County Attorney for a one-year term. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown requested guidelines for advertising the position of County Attorney to be discussed at the upcoming planning retreat. County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue stated that a draft document was placed at each Commissioner's seat tonight for review. It will also be made available at the retreat.

Vote on the motion to appoint Jonathan S. Care as County Attorney for a one-year term was unanimous.

Motion was made by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown, seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, vote unanimous, to appoint the following officials for a one-year term:

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., vote unanimous, that the Board adopt the following schedule of holidays for 2012:

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. that all County Office Buildings shall open at 8:30 a.m. and close at 5:00 p.m. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright to appoint Mike Coghill as Chairman of the Vance County Fire Commission, and Deborah F. Brown and Ronald Jones as members. Vote on this motion was unanimous.

Ms. Nancy Wilson, Tourism Director, was next on the agenda to present a report on the car show that was held in October. She stated that the 10th Annual Show, Shine, Shag and Dine car show was a huge success. It was the largest show since its inception, bringing in approximately 45,000 attendees. A staff of two and 52 volunteers hosted the show which brought in classic cars from 32 states, Canada and Aruba. The show generates approximately \$2.5 to \$3 million during the three days of the show. The show was also filmed for television to be aired in January. Ms. Wilson thanked the Board for its support of Tourism and the car show over the years.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown, on behalf of the Commissioners and the Tourism Board, thanked Ms. Wilson and all the volunteers who make the car show such a successful event.

Mr. Stuart Litvin, Economic Development Director, was next on the agenda and presented the EDC calendar year-end report. The report included information on the revision of by-laws, the formation of a Strategic Plan Committee, the formation of two marketing committees for basic industries and retail, marketing activities, and existing industry retention and expansion. Mr. Litvin also reported on the re-certification process of the Henderson-Vance Industrial Park and Triangle North-Vance sites, and informed the Board of numerous meetings he has attended during the past several months.

Mr. Litvin stated that over his 30 plus years in economic development, Vance County has one of the most professional, welcoming, productive senior staff that he has had the pleasure to work with.

Chairman Garrison thanked Mr. Litvin for his enthusiasm and aggressiveness toward economic development and for his professionalism in advocating and marketing Vance County and the region. Commissioner Dan Brummitt echoed these remarks.

Brian Short, Emergency Operations Director, appeared before the Board and presented bid tabulations for transfer switches. As approved during a previous Board meeting, Vance County, along with nine other counties, received a regional grant award under the 2009 Homeland Security

Grant Program for the purchase of manual transfer switches that will connect portable generator units at emergency shelter locations. Mr. Short stated that this is a \$200,000 reimbursement style grant which requires funds to be spent and then be reimbursed.

Vance County Emergency Operations solicited bids from electrical suppliers and contractors throughout the region and received six responses as follows:

Mr. Short recommended that the bid be awarded to the low bidder, Atlantic Power Solutions, in the amount of \$98,056.00.

Motion was made by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright to award the bid to the low bidder, Atlantic Power Solutions, in the amount of \$98,056.00. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown.

Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. asked what the cost will be to install the switches. Mr. Short responded that it depends on the facility and if additional wiring is needed to provide power to a segmented portion of the school. He stated that he has been in discussions with Mr. Claiborne Woods, Schools Maintenance Director, and he will allow his electrical staff to perform the work at no charge. It is possible that the remaining funds may be used for installation costs if needed. The grant application was not specific regarding this. Mr. Short stated that he is awaiting clarification on this issue.

Vote on the motion to award the bid to the low bidder, Atlantic Power Solutions, in the amount of \$98,056.00 was unanimous.

Mr. Tim Carpenter, Hobbs Upchurch and Associates, was next on the agenda and provided the following update to Phase 1A of the Vance County Water Project:

Commissioner Gordon Wilder stated that this project needs to be pushed forward as soon as possible. Some residents in his district, which is in Phase 1A, have already had wells to go dry while waiting for county water.

Mr. Carpenter stated that one of USDA's checklist items is the approval of the plans and specifications. County Attorney Care stated that the Water District Board will need to approve the plans and specs as well as the Board of Commissioners. This will require giving notice of a special meeting, and approval of the plans and specs should be subject to any changes made by USDA.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, vote unanimous, to approve the project plans and specifications subject to any modifications made by USDA.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to authorize staff to solicit bids for operations and maintenance services. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, vote unanimous, to solicit construction bids according to the time table as presented by Mr. Carpenter.

The Board then discussed scheduling a special called meeting of the Water District Board to approve these items as well. Attorney Care stated that discussions need to take place with the bond counsel to make sure that all items needing approval now will be addressed during the special meeting.

County Manager's Report

Register of Deeds - Resolution. Mr. Ayscue stated that the Register of Deeds Office is currently working to duplicate and automate records. As part of the project, Register of Deeds Carolyn Pecora has determined the need to have 53 microfilm tapes of deeds of trusts copied offsite. The actual (paper) deeds of trusts will not be removed from the Register of Deeds, but the microfilm copies will be taken to the office of Logan Systems in Greensboro, NC for a period of time not to exceed December 6, 2011 through February 29, 2012. North Carolina General Statutes require that the Board of Commissioners approve the removal of public records for any period that exceeds 24 hours.

Mr. Ayscue recommended that the Board approve the resolution that authorizes the Register of Deeds to allow 53 microfilm copies of deeds of trust to be taken to the office of Logan Systems, Inc. in Greensboro, NC to be copied and returned on or before February 29, 2012.

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, vote unanimous, to approve the following resolution which authorizes the Register of Deeds to allow 53 microfilm copies of deeds of trust to be taken to the office of Logan Systems, Inc. in Greensboro, NC to be copied and returned on or before February 29, 2012:

Surplus Waste Box. Mr. Ayscue stated that the County has an old 4 cubic yard solid waste box that is significantly rusted out beyond repair, has not been used for a number of years, and needs to be sold. He requested the Board to declare the box as surplus and authorize the Finance Director to sell it.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to declare the 4 cubic yard solid waste box as surplus and authorize the Finance Director to sell it. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Urgent Repairs - CDBG Scattered Site Grant. Mr. Ayscue explained that according to Board policy for this program, the County Manager has the authority to approve repairs for urgent housing situations that cost no more than \$5,000 each. The policy requires a reporting of such repairs to the Board of Commissioners. In all three cases, three bids were obtained, and the low bid was authorized to proceed with the required work. ① 266 West Andrews Avenue - \$2,300 (remove remaining gutters, replace rotten boards, repair leaks, install handrail); ② 122 Watson Drive - \$3,850 (total roof replacement); ③ 209 Pete Abbott Road - \$3,850 (replace broken steps and install a handicap ramp). He noted that this report was for the Board's information.

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Motion was made by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright, seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., vote unanimous, to approve the position requests as presented.

Public Safety Committee. Mr. Ayscue stated that this Committee met but does not have a recommendation for the Board at this time.

Joint Education Committee. Mr. Ayscue reported that the Joint Education Committee met on Monday, November 21, at the Schools Central Office. The following items were addressed:

Periodic Meetings. Consistent with both full boards, the committee members confirmed the need to commit to regular meetings. It was decided to meet quarterly to ensure ongoing discussion and communication. The value of the opportunity to review needs, concerns, and issues on an ongoing basis was emphasized.

Facility Tour. The Education representatives emphasized their desire for the two full boards to take a tour of the multi-purpose room construction in mid-December. The staffs were asked to poll the boards, starting with a proposed date of December 15.

Budget Planning for FY 2012-13. Given the economic times, the committee agreed there is a need to begin early discussions of budget needs. The Superintendent stressed the desire of the

Schools to apprise the County of its needs well in advance of the time that budget requests are submitted.

Long-Term Facility Planning. In response to a request for long-range plans for school facilities, the Superintendent expressed a willingness to develop and provide five-year, ten-year, and fifteen-year facility plans.

Qualified Zone Academy Bonds. As previously outlined, in 2009 the two boards sought and obtained approval of 2009 Qualified Zone Academy Bonds (QZABs) in the amount of \$2 million, with the understanding that they cannot be activated until the County takes action to do so. This last batch of QZABs will expire 12/31/11 if not used; however, State officials have indicated a willingness to transfer the same amount of funding to the 2010 authority, thus providing a 12-month extension (until 12/31/12), pending a letter of request from the Schools. About half of the QZAB proceeds were designated for roof replacements at Dabney, Aycock, and Zeb Vance Elementary Schools, all of which had ten-year roofs. Those roofs now are between 16 and almost 20 years old. Improvements at other schools were included in the funding application. With the 12-month extension, the County can better identify funding for the payback as current debt on the three schools will be paid off in the next two to three years, freeing up funds for the new QZAB repayment.

Pending Business

County Water Project. Phase 1A. City of Henderson staff have given their stamp of approval on the final plans and specifications. State USDA staff is currently reviewing the final plans and specifications. USDA RD has informed the engineer that the County can go to the bidding phase and ultimately to construction upon meeting the remaining requirements. The Phase 1A only agreement is for up to 150,000 gallons of water per day and does not include any provisions for operations and maintenance. An RFP for operations and maintenance services has been developed and will be advertised and distributed during the first week in December. Local permits have been obtained and right-of-way encroachment agreements for primary and secondary roads have been approved by NCDOT. NCDOT continues its review of encroachment agreements for interstate and controlled access highways. Permits are also currently being reviewed by NC DENR and it is anticipated that these reviews will be completed within the next few days. A site for an overhead water tank has been located and a formal agreement is being processed (per previous Water Board action). A meter vault site (i.e. tie-in point to City of

Henderson water system) has been selected and work is underway to purchase the small site. With technical assistance from the engineer, the staff has begun to research the locations where additional private right-of-way and utility easements will be necessary from property owners. The associated title work and preparation of easement agreements are in process. *Phase 1B*. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. Phases 2A & 2B. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. Highway right-of-way encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Sign-ups continue to be received for the two phases. Through special funding, an engineering firm, Dewberry & Davis, conducted door-to-door sign-ups in June, starting with Thomas Road and working other roads in the general area as designated by Hobbs & Upchurch. Initial indications from that work show that additional sign-ups will be essential in order to have enough of a concentrated customer base to effectively redesign the project. Due to the nature of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible after Phase 1A work is underway. A water purchase agreement with the City will need to be negotiated for these two phases together.

County Attorney's Report

Neighborhood Stabilization Program. County Attorney Jonathan S. Care stated that after speaking with the School of Government regarding the method required to sell NSP properties, the County is allowed to act as a Housing Authority. This means that the County does not have to go through the bid and upset bid process. This streamlines the process and eliminates confusion and complicating factors of the program. An established list of priorities will be developed in the event of multiple offers on one property. These priorities will consist of program qualifications in order to ensure the home goes to the most qualified buyer. The goal is to market and sell these properties in the first quarter of next year.

Pending Legal Cases. Attorney Care updated the Board on some pending legal cases with inmates regarding claimed missing personal property. One claim was scheduled for trial last week. The second was filed and scheduled a summary judgment motion last week. Both trials were ruled in favor of the County and those cases are now closed.

There are two other cases ongoing. One regarding a squatter in a tax foreclosed property, and the other is the enforcement of the junkyard ordinance on a property on Lynnbank Road.
