The Vance County Board of Commissioners sitting as the Vance County Water District Board met in special session on Monday, December 19, 2011 at 4:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairman Terry E. Garrison, Commissioners Thomas S. Hester, Jr., Deborah F. Brown, Dan Brummitt, and J. Timothy Pegram.

Absent: Commissioner Eddie L. Wright.

Tardy: Commissioner Gordon Wilder.

Also present were County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue, Finance Director Steven C. Stanton, County Attorney Jonathan S. Care, and Clerk to the Board Kelly H. Grissom.

Chairman Terry E. Garrison gave the invocation.

County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue stated that, as advertised, the Board is meeting as the Water District Board to approve matters that were previously approved by the Board of Commissioners during its December 5, 2011 meeting.

Items needing approval were as follows:

- 1. Approve project plans and specifications subject to any modifications made by USDA.
- 2. Authorize staff to solicit bids for operations and maintenance services.
- 3. Solicit construction bids according to the engineer's time table.
- 4. Other items as needed.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the project plans and specifications subject to any modifications made by USDA. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt to authorize staff to solicit bids for operations and maintenance services. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and unanimously approved.

Commissioner Gordon Wilder was now present.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown, vote unanimous, to solicit construction bids according to the engineer's time table as presented during a previous meeting. County Attorney Jonathan S. Care stated that the County's bond counsel, Tom Lee, in reviewing what needed to be done after the bond referendum passed, brought to light that one resolution formally approving the bond election results needs to be approved. Attorney Care suggested that both the Water Board and the Board of Commissioners approve this resolution.

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, vote unanimous, to designate Mr. Brian Short and Mr. William Reavis to represent Vance County on reimbursements and costs associated with Hurricane Irene recovery, and authorize them to execute any related FEMA documents pertaining to this recovery.

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Vance County Board of Commissioners that the above-named primary and secondary agents are hereby authorized to execute and file applications for federal and/or state assistance on behalf of the County for the purpose of obtaining certain state and federal assistance under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief & Emergency Assistance Act, (Public Law 93-288 as amended) or as otherwise available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above-named agents are authorized to represent and act for the County in all dealings with the State of North Carolina and the Federal Emergency Management Agency for all matters pertaining to such disaster assistance required by the grant agreements and assurances.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the above-named agents are authorized to act severally.
